6. Be mindful of players' emotions and damage caused to young players by overly aggressive sideline behavior.

What programs do you coach and how long have you been coaching with Bowie FC?

I coach the Girls County 2013/2014 Red team and have been coaching for 7 years with Bowie FC.

When did you begin coaching? What got you interested?

I began coaching intramural/developmental in 2018. I became interested in coaching because I believe it's important to have more female coaches in youth soccer. All children benefit by seeing women in leadership roles as head coaches. As a coach in our girls program, I feel a deep responsibility towards the development of the girls as well-rounded soccer players, skilled athletes, supportive teammates, and strong leaders. Statistically, girls give up organized sports at a much higher rate than boys. I want to help reverse this trend by empowering my players to continue playing through middle and high school, and hopefully into college.

I grew up in Linthicum, MD and played county soccer for LFYAA. I was on the soccer and track teams at North County High School and the track team at Salisbury State University.
